## **DESCRIPTION:**

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (https://r4phtc.org/).

Note: This placement will be 100% in person at the address listed above. The agency has resources for free housing for interested students.

Homeland Heart provides birth and postpartum doula support to Black families in Middle TN. We work with partner universi.es and agencies to conduct research that will facilitate the elimination of maternal health dispari.es. Our mission is to improve Black maternal health outcomes by increasing access to culturally competent care provided by community based perinatal care providers.

#### **POSITION DESCRIPTION:**

The student intern would be working on the Tennessee Doula Pilot Project. The student would have the opportunity to assist with data collection and effective communication to ensure a closed referral loop for clients. Clients are to be communicated with at specific intervals to ensure proper care has been provided in a timely manner. Reports will be due monthly to validate efficacy of 'doula intervention.' The objective of this pilot is to inform state policies that will need to be considered regarding the future of Medicaid reimbursement for doulas.

### **QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:**

Preference will be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. Will also consider undergraduate public health students (juniors/seniors) and part-time students (graduate). Students must complete the program prior to graduation. Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.

- Please include a resume with the following:
  - The name and department of your degree program
  - Year of study
  - Expected graduation date

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

\* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

**APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION:** Approximately 25 hours a week for 10 weeks.
