DESCRIPTION:

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<u>https://r4phtc.org/)</u>.

Note: Though 100% in person is ideal, a remote or hybrid option may be available.

The Florida Department of Health Walton County (DOH-Walton) and the Walton Community Health Center, Inc. (WCHC) provide public health and medical services in Walton County. Employees work to serve needs in areas that range from controlling infectious diseases to safe drinking water to disaster preparedness. DOH-Walton works closely with the County Commissioners, the Emergency Response Division, and other local and federal agencies to protect the health and welfare of Walton County residents and visitors. Many of these other agencies participate in the Walton Community Health Improvement Partnership (WHCIP), a dedicated group of people from a variety of agencies, organizations, businesses, and community members. The mission of the Florida Department of Health is to protect, promote & improve the health of all people in Florida through integrated state, county & community efforts and the vision is to be the healthiest state in the nation.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The student will work on projects related to the Regional Housing Summit between Okaloosa and Walton Counties scheduled for May 13th. They will assist with post-Summit action items including, but not limited to, report generation, action planning, evaluations, and other actionable initiatives resulting from the event.

Following the summit, the student will assist with the Walton Community Health Improvement Partnership workgroup focusing on housing. This includes other sectors such as non-profits, economic development alliances, businesses, and local government members.

PREFFERED QUALIFICATIONS:

- A desire to help others and help make a community a healthier place to live, learn, work, play, and pray.
- Knowledge of and experience with computer software, including but not limited to:
 - Windows (Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint)
 - Adobe Creative Cloud (Photoshop, Illustrator, and/or inDesign).
- Ability to collect, evaluate and analyze data.
- Ability to organize data into logical format for presentation in reports, documents and other written materials.

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO APPLY:

Preference will be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. Will consider parttime students (graduate). Students must complete the program prior to graduation. Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.

 - The semesters you are applying for (Summer 2024)

- The title of the position you are applying to
- Citizenship or permanent resident visa status
- Please include a resume with the following:
 - The name and department of your degree program
 - Year of study
 - Expected graduation date
- Please also include the following with your application:
 - Writing sample

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: Approximately 24 hours a week for 10 weeks.

*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will be also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
