DESCRIPTION:

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<u>https://r4phtc.org/</u>).

Note: This placement will be 100% in person.

The Georgia Department of Public Health (DPH) is the lead agency with a mission of preventing disease, injury and disability; promoting health and well-being; and preparing for and responding to disasters from a health perspective. Operating across divisions, sections, programs, and offices at the state level, DPH collaborates with Georgia's 159 county health departments and 18 public health districts to ensure the vision of creating a safe and healthy Georgia. This position will be in the Oral Health Office.

The mission of the Oral Health Office is to eliminate health disparities and bring optimal oral health to all the people of Georgia. The office coordinates and supports dental clinics in the 18 health districts across the state.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

During the 2025-26 school year the Office of Oral Health will be conducting a Basic Screening Survey (BSS) of third grade students. The BSS involves data collection throughout the state at multiple elementary schools. Our objective is to determine the current status of oral health of elementary school children in Georgia, to define barriers that exist throughout the state, and ultimately to have a usable data set to guide future program development. The student will have the opportunity to be part of the BSS process in a variety of ways.

The student will assist the Department of Public Health State Dental Director in collaborating with the Department of Education and elementary school partners, with coordinating data collection efforts, and with qualitative and quantitative data analysis. The student will also play a role in selecting data

collection methods and coordinating these efforts with staff in the 18 health districts. The student will also have the opportunity to communicate oral health content to school partners.

THE STUDENT WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO ASSIST WITH THE FOLLOWING ACTIVITIES:

- 1. Development of pre-planning documentation
- 2. Assist with developing data collection methods
- 3. Assist in communication and coordination of school screening data efforts across the State
- 4. Conduct and participate in local data collection efforts
- 5. Attend meeting and progress report sessions
- 6. Communicate audience appropriate oral health content to stakeholders and partners.

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: Approximately 15-20 hours a week for 10-20 weeks.

*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will be also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
