DESCRIPTION:

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center (<u>https://r4phtc.org/</u>).

Note: This position will be 100% in person at the agency site.

Vision: Empowering the residents of Eastern Kentucky to make healthier choices for themselves and their communities.

The Kentucky River District Health Department (KRDHD) serves 7 counties in Eastern Kentucky- Lee, Letcher, Leslie, Knott, Owsley, Perry, and Wolfe. The Health Department provides services such as:

- Preventive Services: Immunizations, health screenings, and wellness programs to help you stay healthy.
- HANDS: Help promote healthy pregnancies and births; healthy child growth and development; healthy, safe homes; and self-sufficient families.
- Home Health: Providing quality in-home health care allowing people to remain at home.
- Community Outreach: Educational campaigns and events to raise awareness about important health topics.
- Emergency Preparedness: Information and resources to help you prepare for and respond to health emergencies.
- Environmental Health: Efforts to ensure clean air, water, and safe living conditions for all residents.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The Kentucky River District Health Department (KRDHD) is working toward public health accreditation. The student, alongside their supervisor, will have the opportunity to work with various committees to ensure compliance with accreditation standards and measures. The student will help to review standards, current practices and work with committees to establish recommendations for leadership team on steps needed to work toward needed changes or updates.

Preference will be given to masters or doctoral level public health graduate students. Graduate Social Work students may also be considered. Past recipients of the Pathways to Practice Award are not eligible to apply again.

WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: 15-30 hours a week for 15-20 weeks.

*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
