DESCRIPTION:

The following position is offered as a field placement through the Region IV Public Health Training Center.

Note: This position is 100% in person.

The Grayson County Health Department (GCHD) follows the national model of public health which is to prevent, promote, and protect. There are several different health departments throughout the state. Some health departments are part of a district while others are independent. GCHD is an independent health department. Although independent, GCHD is affiliated with the Kentucky Department for Public Health. GCHD is managed by the Grayson County Board of Health.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The student will work closely with the Accreditation Coordinator to support the health department in achieving public health accreditation. Responsibilities will include assisting with data entry, organizing and uploading documents into a shared drive, and collaborating with various programs and departments to ensure accreditation domain requirements are met. The student will contribute to the review and development of policies and procedures, support the creation of accreditation plans, and assist in producing documentation required for accreditation.

This role will also involve creating professional documents and materials using a variety of platforms, including Canva, SurveyMonkey, Excel, and Word, as well as designing data visualizations to clearly communicate findings and progress. In addition, the student will complete a structured rotation throughout the health department to observe and gain a broad understanding of the functions of various programs and services.

Through this placement, the student will gain hands-on experience in public health accreditation processes, policy development, program planning, and quality improvement initiatives, while building skills in communication, problem-solving, and data-informed decision-making.

WORK AUTHORIZATION: U.S. Citizen, Permanent U.S. Resident

Citizenship statement: The Region IV Public Health Training Center is a federally-funded program which has a citizenship requirement. To be eligible to apply for this position, you must be either a U.S. citizen, a non-citizen U.S. national, or a foreign national having in your possession a visa permitting permanent residence in the U.S.

AWARD LEVEL: \$3,500 award

* Note: Travel costs will not be covered by the program beyond the total \$3,500 award.

APPROXIMATE HOURS PER WEEK & DURATION: 10-25 hours a week for 10-12 weeks.

*Students may be limited in the minimum or maximum number of hours they can work per semester based on their university, school or degree's policies. If this work will also be used as a graduation requirement, the student should verify those requirements and abide by their university policies.
